## KEYNOTE SPEAKER

**DR. JILL B. HAMILTON** is an associate professor in the UNC School of Nursing. She earned her bachelor's, master's and doctorate in nursing from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and a bachelor's degree in accounting from North Carolina Central University. Her postdoctoral training in the nursing care of older adults was completed at Oregon Health and Science University. Dr. Hamilton's research interests include health disparities, social and cultural factors that influence health and the coping strategies of older African-American cancer survivors and their families. She has developed measures of coping and spirituality and is currently exploring the sociocultural factors that influence how older African-Americans use social support and spirituality to cope with a diagnosis of cancer. Dr. Hamilton is published on topics related to social support, religion and quality of life among African-American cancer survivors. She was a Georgia Cancer Coalition Distinguished Cancer Scholar from 2003-07 and is currently a faculty scholar at the Center for Spirituality, Theology and Health at Duke University. Dr. Hamilton was the recipient of the 2011 Oncology Nursing Society (ONS) Publishing's Division Award for Excellence in Writing Qualitative Research.
