The year 2006 marked the highest enrollment at NCCU School of Law. We received over 2,500 applications and matriculated the largest entering class the law school has ever seen with 190 students in the Day Program and 37 students in the Evening Program! The National Jurist magazine in January 2005 ranked NCCU School of Law 18th in its National Honor Roll listing for technology. The Princeton Review chose this school for inclusion in the new 2007 edition of its annual book, "Best 170 Law Schools". NCCU School of Law is one of 11 law schools that The Princeton Review is adding to its annual "best law schools" guidebook this year. The 2006 class scored an 86% bar passage rate. Below are some more interesting facts about the 2006 entering class.

## OVERVIEW

The Law School offers two programs leading to the Juris Doctor degree: a full-time Day Program and the only part-time Evening Program between Atlanta, GA and Washington, DC. The mission of the Law School is to provide a challenging and broad-based educational program designed to foster in each student a deep sense of professional responsibility and personal integrity.

## ALUMNI

NCCU has produced alumni who have achieved distinguished careers in private practice, public service, and government. Some notable alumni include: North Carolina Governor Michael Easley, U.S. House of Representatives member G.K. Butterfield, and prominent attorney, Willie Gary.

## CLINICS

Currently the School of Law offers 7 clinical programs. They are: Alternative Dispute Resolution, Civil Litigation, Criminal Litigation, Family Law, Juvenile Law, and Small Business. And a General Externship Program; making it the most comprehensive program of any law school in the state.

## OTHER STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

There are 18 states and several other countries represented in the 2006 entering class. The students in the Day Program range in age from 21—48 with an average age of 26. The Day Program's entering class is 57% female and 43% male. There are students from over 70 colleges and universities nationwide including UNC Chapel Hill, Morehouse, Spelman, Hampton, North Carolina State, Howard, North Carolina Central, North Carolina A & T and Winston-Salem University.
