The year 2005 marked a record year at the NCCU School of Law. We received over 2,000 applications and matriculated the largest entering class the law school has ever seen with 171 students in the Day Program and 30 students in the Evening Program! ## ALUMNI

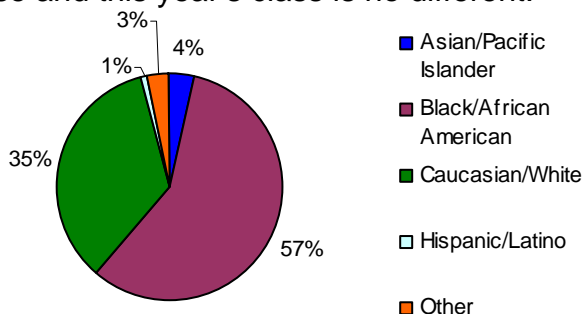
