NCAA Transfer Portal

- NCAA allows for **1 time transfer** from any 4-year institution to another 4-year institution in all sports without having to sit a year of residency
- If you have **graduated** with your bachelorette degree, you can transfer again without having to sit a year of residency if the 2nd institution does not offer the academic program you are selecting at your 3rd.
- If a student is trying to transfer for a **3rd time** for anything outside of a documented mental health condition where the student has been advised to relocate per their medical provider (it helping their situation), a documented physical or sexual assault, or a student-athlete health/safety condition documented by their physician; they will have to sit a year of residency. *(NCAA has only approved 1/3 multi-transfer waivers)*
- If an institution is bringing in a **4-year transfer from another institution** and the student **was on athletic aid** at the previous school – the 2nd institution **MUST PAY FOR THEIR REMAINING** bachelors degree (even if they deem themselves ineligible/quit the team/is removed off the team – unless it is for a institutional/non-athlete suspension such as Title IX or police matter)

Name, Image & Likeness (NIL)

The NCAA national office continues to receive numerous questions about the application of NCAA legislation and Name, Image and Likeness (NIL) Interim Policy when various state laws address NIL in different and sometimes contrary ways.

1. It is clear that institutions may not compensate a student-athlete for use of NIL. Is it permissible for an entity closely associated with an institution to compensate student-athletes for use of their NIL?
2. Are boosters or a collection of boosters permitted to have contact with prospective student-athletes (PSA) and discuss potential NIL opportunities should the individual decide to attend a particular school?
3. Is it permissible for an institution to provide special benefits to boosters in return for the booster donating funds to a collective?
4. Is it permissible for an individual or collection of individuals to condition payment of NIL compensation on a student-athlete's attendance at a particular school?
5. It is clear student-athletes may not be compensated for participating in a competition and may not be compensated for promoting such competition. Is it permissible for an event sponsor or another institution to pay a collective, which, in turn, compensates student-athletes?
6. Some current and proposed state laws appear to now prohibit the NCAA from enforcing its rules. What is the NCAA's position on its approach when an institution in one of those states violates NCAA legislation?
