### **CREAR Futuros**

#### What is CREAR Futuros?

**CREAR Futuros** (College Readiness, Achievement, and Retention) is an initiative funded with support from the Hispanic Federation. CREAR Futoros is designed as a peer-mentoring program to engage qualified Black and Latino students from various educational institutions. Students take on the role of mentors to guide and provide support to their younger counterparts, helping them navigate the educational landscape.

Notably, North Carolina Central University (NCCU) holds the unique position of being the only Historically Black College and University (HBCU) partnering with CREAR Futuros, as well as the only participating institution in the state of North Carolina.

**CREAR Futuros** is committed to enhancing the academic success of its participants through a comprehensive approach designed to elevate GPAs, improve course completion rates, and increase graduation retention.

CREAR Futuros aims to create a supportive environment that propels students toward their academic goals by nurturing a sense of community, cultivating leadership skills, and fostering meaningful connections.

### **Grant Awards**

The total grant amount for the first year of CREAR Futuros from the Hispanic Federation was \$52,000.

- \$32,400 Student stipends for four mentors at \$8,100 each
- \$4,600 Campus activities, programming, scholarships
- \$15,000 CREAR Futuros Liaison/Graduate Assistant

#### **Mentors**

- Mentors are responsible for a cohort of 15 mentees.
- The Hispanic Federation has developed a specialized curriculum to support mentors in both one-on-one and group cohort meetings.
- Once a month, mentors and liaisons convene in a virtual setting for additional training sessions.






## **LC Industries**
