• College of Arts, Social Sciences and Humanities

- The NCCU Jazz Ensemble has been selected to participate in the Monterey Jazz Festival in September of 2023.
- The Monterey Jazz Festival is one of the longest-running and most prestigious jazz festivals in the world.

• University College

- Aspiring Eagles Academy is preparing to receive 60 new first-time freshmen on June 25th. The summer bridge program will take place from June 25- July 28th.
- Academic Advising has prepared students to transition to the upper division as of May 30, 2023.
- Academic Coaching is facilitating three student engagement workshops entitled "Surviving the Summer"- The objective is to teach students how to manage their time, organizational skills, and syllabus mapping.
- University College hired 25 University Teaching fellows (student-teachers) to support UNIV 1100 instructors.
- University College is training all UNIV 1100 instructors on July 13-14, 2023 (UNIV 1100 Summer Institute).









• College of Health and Sciences

- Netanya Dennis, May 2023 graduate, has been admitted to the Neuroscience Ph.D. program at Yale University.
- Kristen Hauser, May 2023 graduate, has been admitted to the Master of Business and Science program at Rutgers University (Cheatham-White Scholar).
- Nia Martin (junior, chemistry major) and Dionne Mitchell (junior, chemistry major), have been admitted into the 3+2 B.S./M.S Packaging Program at Michigan State University (Cheatham-White Scholars).

• School of Education

- Two endowed faculty searches underway: Brenda Brodie Endowed Professorship (Teacher Education) and Goodnight Distinguished Professorship of Early Literacy (Reading).
- Collaboration with NCTR Residency Foundation National Center for Teacher Residencies Initiative and CREED to increase the number of diverse teachers.
- Ongoing efforts with the NC Pipeline Collaborative Initiative via Public Schools Forum of NC, to increase the number of diverse teachers.









- School of Library and Information Sciences (SLIS)
 - Dr. Patrick Roughen published a peer reviewed research study that examines how the history of paper-making has shaped the progression of public libraries in light of advances in digital technology.
 - Dr. Erezi Ogbo was selected to attend the New York University Faculty Resource Network Summer 2023 seminar, *Writing and Research Across the Curriculum: Embodied and Digital Place in an Age of Disinformation.* The summer program will take place June 5 9, 2023.
 - Dr. Alexandra Chassanoff and her students received press coverage for the Hacking into History project that digitizes land records in Durham including on ABC 11 and the *News and Observer*.
 - Dr. Chris Cunningham is a member of the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions working group and is developing international guidelines to improve library science education through an initiative entitled "Building Strong Library and Information Science Education" (BSLISE).
 - SLIS alum Kelvin Watson is the recipient of the 2023 American Library Association Medal of Excellence Award which recognizes creative leadership in the fields of library management, library training, cataloging and classification, and the tools and techniques of librarianship.









• School of Law

- Officially launched the Social Justice Research Institute.
- The Perkins Coie Foundation ("Donor") committed \$300,000 over three years for Law School Scholarships.
- Judge Patricia Timmons-Goodson has been appointed Dean of the School of Law, effective July 1, 2023.

- Took 10 students on a Study Abroad Trip to Costa Rica
 - These were graduating Seniors who missed their opportunity to travel abroad earlier due to Covid-19.
