The original BOG Out-of-State threshold was 18% of the incoming FTFT class. BOG changed it to 25% of the incoming FTFT class as of Fall 2021 for certain UNC System schools including NCCU. The BOG changed it again to 35% of the prior class beginning with Fall 2022 for certain UNC System schools including NCCU.



## **Academic Affairs Highlights**

#### College of Health and Sciences

- Departments of Mathematics and Physics and Biological and Biomedical Sciences received a \$2.9 million dollar grant from the National Science Foundation to advance research, academics and entrepreneurship in STEM.
- The NCLEX pass rate for traditional students in the Department of Nursing was 94% for May 2023, compared to 61.54% for May 2022. The pass rate for December 2022 graduates of the accelerated program was 92%, compared to 100% for December 2021.
- Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry established a 3+2 program in packaging with Michigan State University.

#### • School of Education

- Dr. Alyx Beckwith, Counseling Faculty, named Engaged Faculty Scholar by North Carolina Campus Engagement.
- Dr. Regina Gavin-Williams, Counseling Faculty, appointed chair of the State Youth Council by Governor Cooper. As chair, Dr. Gavin-Williams will host the State Wide Leadership Day Conference for the State Youth Council October 7, 2023 at NCCU/SOE.









## **Academic Affairs Highlights**

#### School of Business

- Cybersecurity program designated as a Center of Academic Excellence (CAE) for Cyber Defense by the National Security Agency and the Department of Homeland Security. The CAE designation is awarded to academic institutions that meet stringent criteria set forth by the National Security Agency.
- Cybersecurity program received a \$150,000 grant from the National Science Foundation to develop a GenCyber Camp for underrepresented high school students.
- The Information Technology program will officially be named the Lowe's Bachelor of Science in Information Technology Program.
- In June, four students participated in the Institute of Design at Stanford University's Innovation Fellows Program.
- Dr. Beverly Bryant received the Joe Perdue Memorial Award for her outstanding contributions and efforts in advancing the mission of the Accreditation Commission for Programs in Hospitality Administration (ACPHA).
- Offered four summer camps in the areas of entrepreneurship, financial education, accounting, and cybersecurity. Campers were engaged in real-world learning experiences, student interactions, enriching activities, and campus tours.


#### • University College

- Aspiring Eagles Academy prepared 60 new first-time freshmen during summer 2023.
- Average cumulative GPA for the Aspiring Eagles after summer 2023 courses was 3.8.

#### • School of Library and Information Sciences (SLIS)

- SLIS received grants from the National Institutes of Health; Benton Institute for Broadband and Society; and the NC State Friday Institute/NC Department of Information Technology
- SLIS faculty were accepted to the American Association of Colleges and Universities' inaugural Institute on Digital Equity.
  - Seven month engagement designed to accelerate the work of teams pursuing digital equity on their campus and in their community. Members of the NCCU/SLIS team are Erezi Ogbo, Patrice Walker, Christopher Lawson, and Siobahn Grady.
- Dr. Erezi Ogbo has been invited to present at the following conferences this fall:
  - The Research Conference on Communications, Information, and Internet Policy in Washington, DC, September 22-23. Presentation title "If we build it, will they come?"
  - Digital Inclusion Research Forum in Dallas, Texas, October 12-13. Presentation title "Uptake and Impact of Digital Inclusion Programs."
