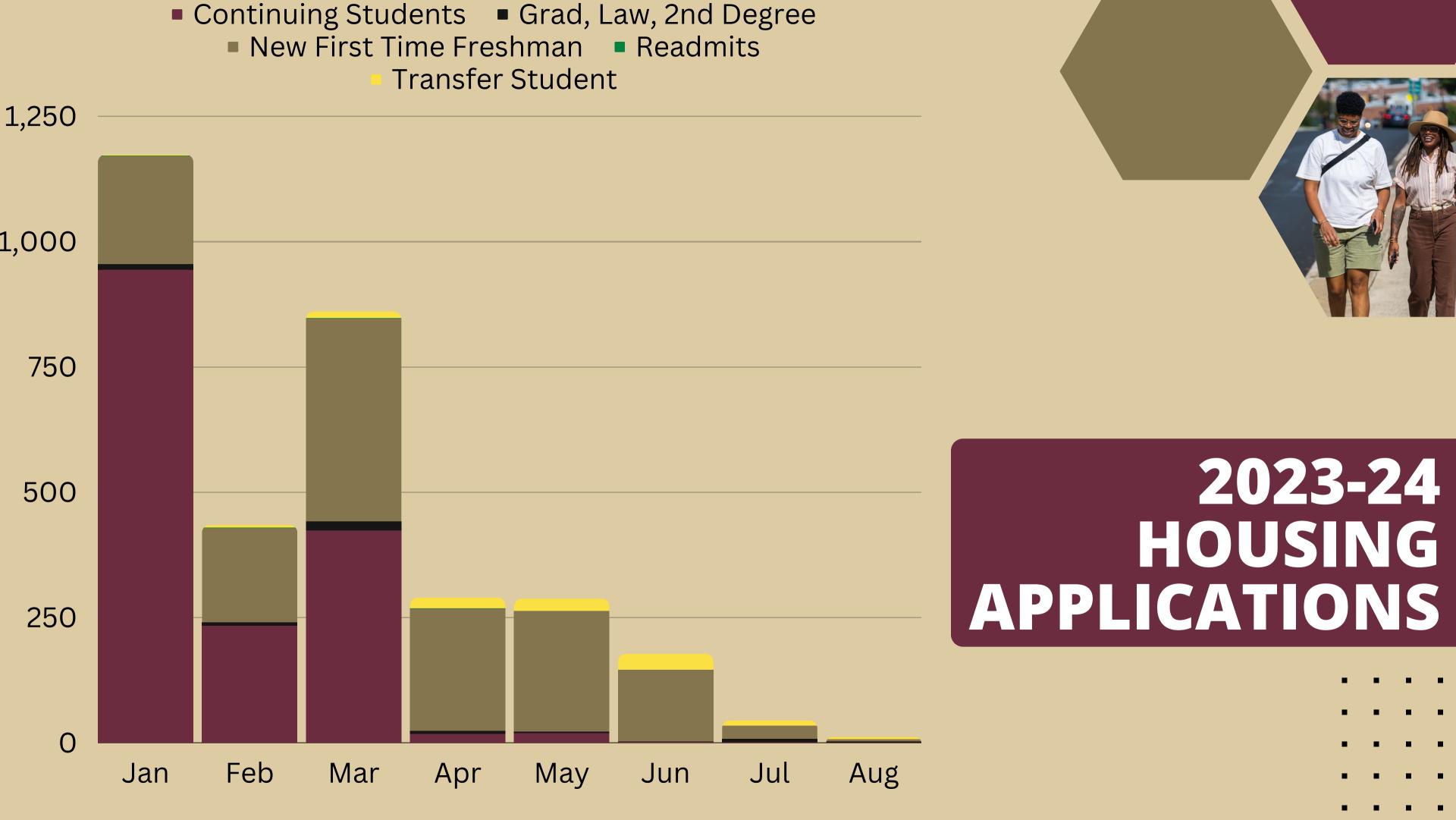

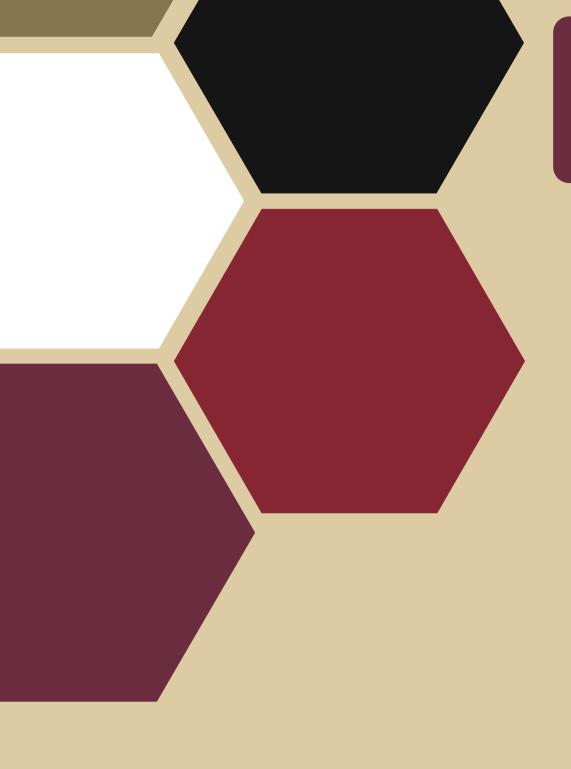
NCCU Joins The Jed Foundation
