

Foundations of American Democracy Requirement





Foundations of American Democracy Requirement

- Per <u>UNC Policy 400.1.5</u>, for students entering on or after July 1, 2025, UNC institutions will require, as a condition of awarding a baccalaureate degree, that students successfully complete a course or courses covering the foundations of American democracy and meet the following student learning outcomes:
 - Evaluate key concepts, principles, arguments, and contexts in founding documents of the American republic, including the United States Constitution, the Declaration of Independence, and a representative selection of the Federalist Papers.
 - Evaluate key milestones in progress and challenges in the effort to form "a more perfect Union," including the arguments and contexts surrounding the Gettysburg Address, the Emancipation Proclamation, and the Letter from Birmingham Jail, as well as other texts that reflect the breadth of American experiences.





Foundations of American Democracy Requirement

- At NCCU, History 1320, World Societies, will serve as the course to meet both student learning outcomes, as this is a General Education Curriculum requirement for all students.
- Students transferring to NCCU from non-UNC institutions (or those bringing in AP or other college credits who do not need to take HIST 1320) will complete a self-paced asynchronous module (not for course credit) in Canvas during their first semester to meet the Foundations of American Democracy (FAD) requirement.
- The following units are working together to create a seamless plan for implementation and transcript designation:
 - Office of Academic Programs and Undergraduate Research
 - Department of History
 - University College
 - Office of Transfer Services
 - Upper-level Academic Advisors
