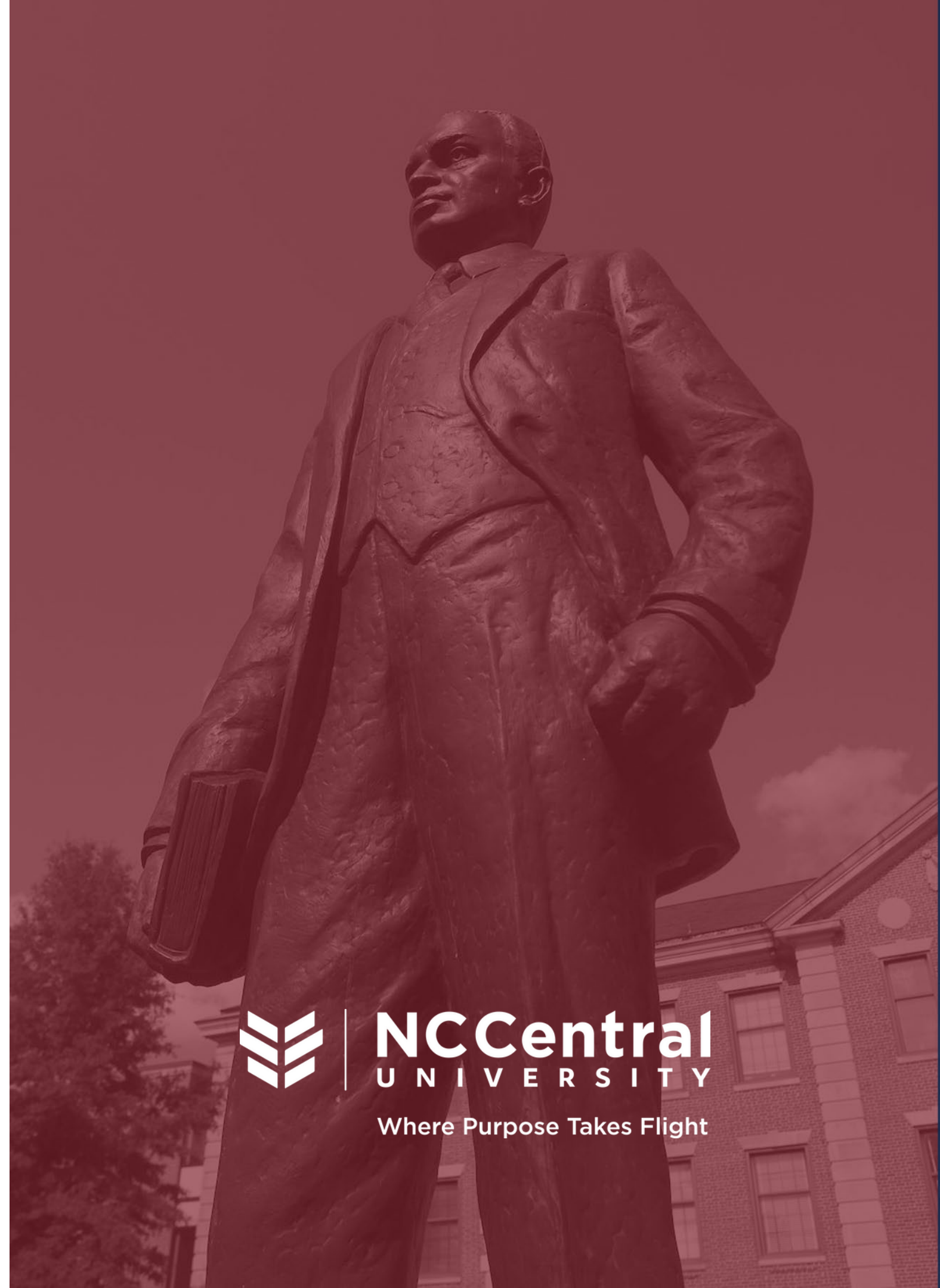

Total 1,975

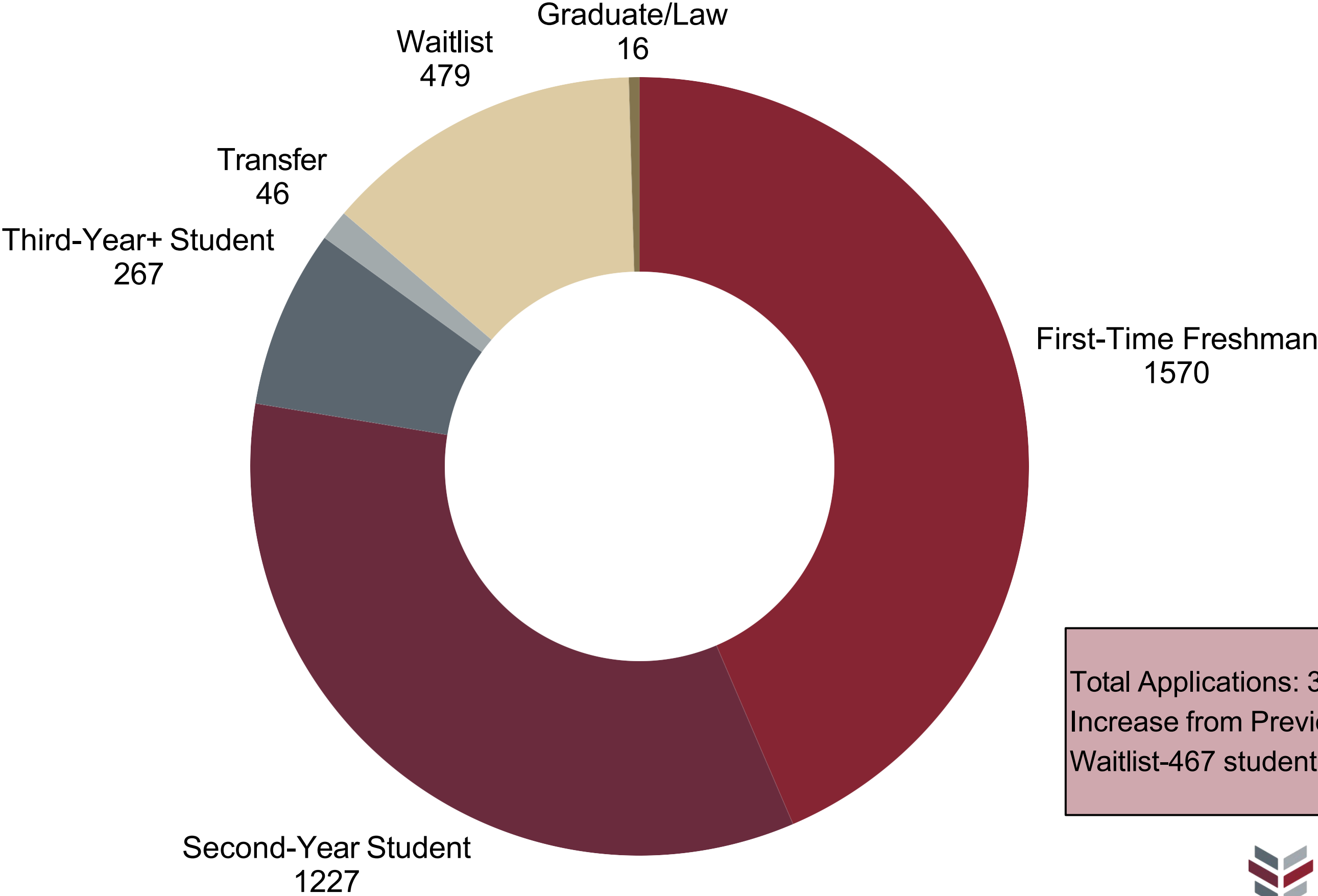

Enhancing Health, Safety, and Student Well-Being

Proactive Health & Safety Measures

Room-by-Room Inspections

- Initiated April 17, 2025, with walkthroughs in all residence halls to assess conditions directly and collect real-time student feedback.
- Now institutionalized montly during the Fall and Spring semester to catch and address issues early
 - Residential Life is coordinating with Facilities Housekeeping to ensure private bathrooms are cleaned at least once per semester

Expanded Pest Control

Enhanced treatment schedules with external vendors to manage and prevent pest issues across residence halls

Air Quality & Ventilation Focus

Identified and acted on:

- Need for deep-cleaned vents & new air filters
- Mold/mildew due to inadequate ventilation
- Contractors hired for immediate remediation and summer deep-cleaning



Residential Life Facilities Investments

This summer, the university invested over **\$2.9M** in repairs and upgrades to deferred maintenance.

The list of priorities includes:

1. Deep Cleaning
2. HVAC repairs
3. Fire alarm repairs
4. Carpentry repairs (ceiling, wall repair, and etc.)
5. Fire alarm repairs
6. Elevator repairs

- Support kits prepared for students in rooms with shared cleaning responsibilities, emphasizing partnership in maintaining healthy living spaces

Preparation for Major Investments

Active collaboration with state legislators; \$100M budget proposal includes:

- Bringing offline residence hall back into service
- Infrastructure modernization (HVAC, plumbing, elevators)
- Expansion of affordable off-campus housing options

Next Steps

- Complete summer deep cleaning, painting, and repairs
- Complete move in inspections of residence halls
- Continue regular student communications and feedback integration
