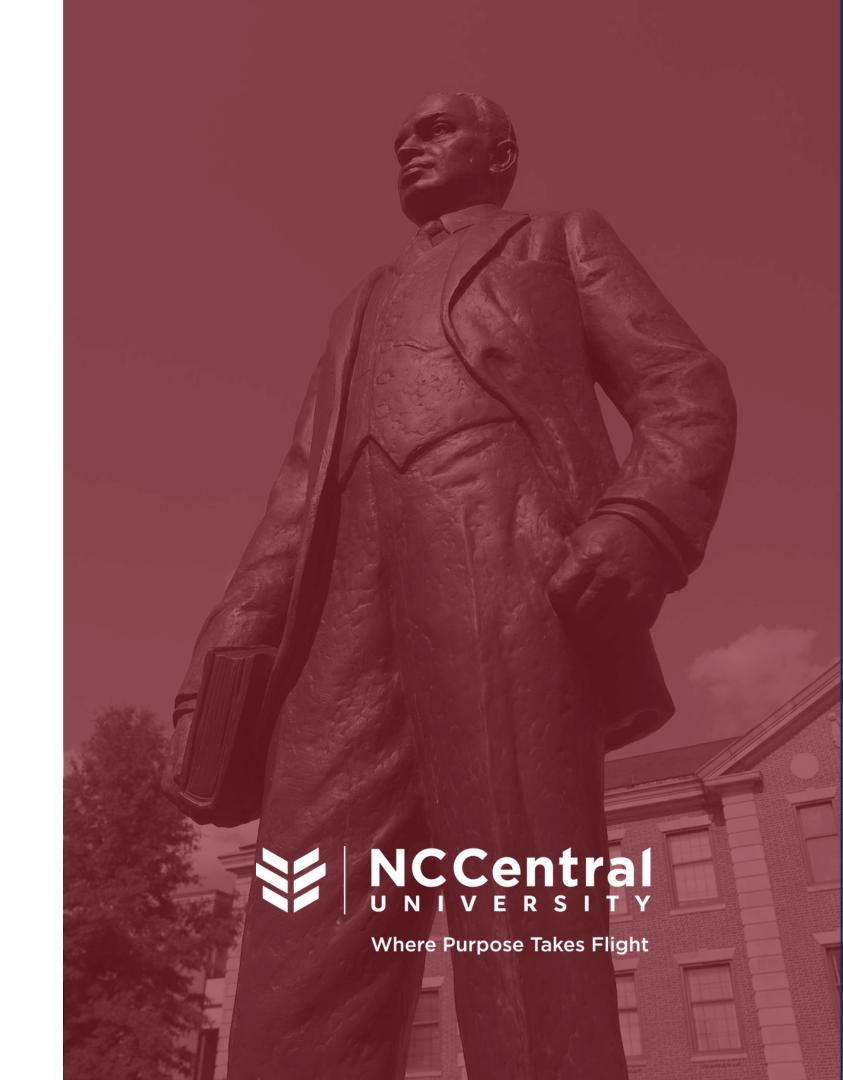
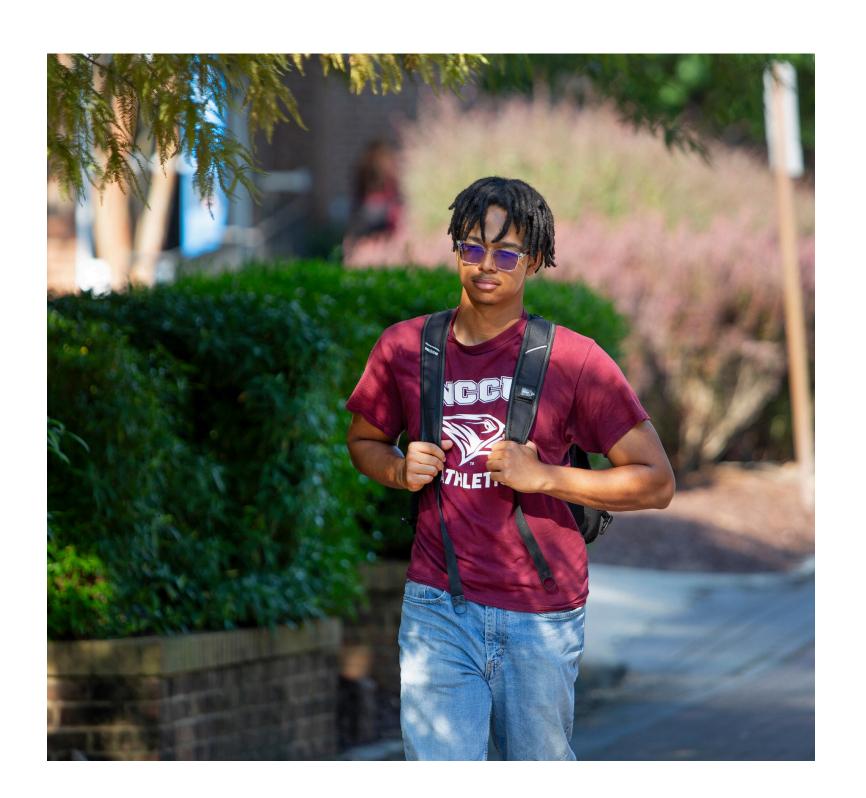

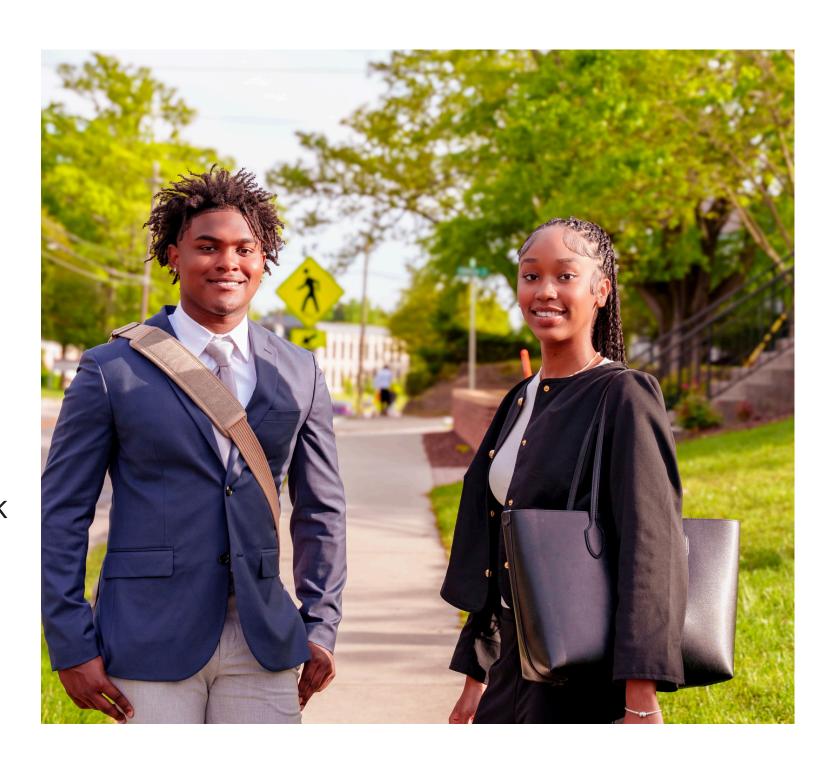






Division of Student Affairs: 2025–26 Priorities

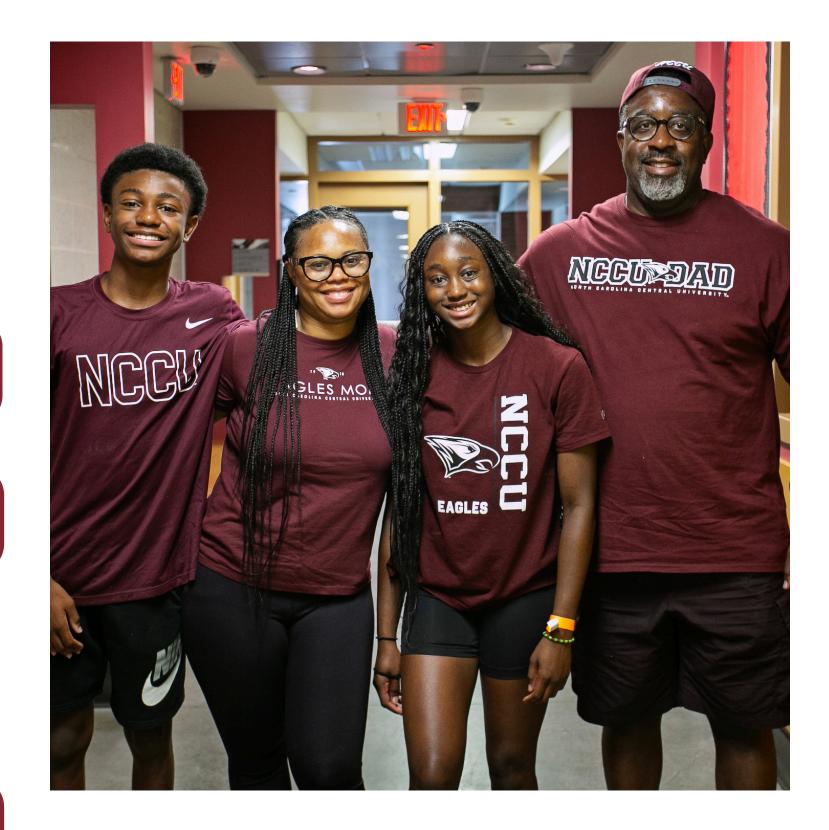

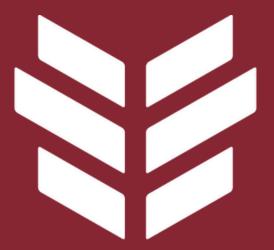
