



NCCUAA Fiscal Health Overview

As of FY25, NCCUAA's Fiscal Health Remains In Good Standing

- Revenues outpaced expenses by \$227K, an increase of 37.19% over the prior year. The major operating revenue drivers are Mr./Ms. Alumni Scholarship, in-kind contributions, and membership dues (annual and lifetime).
- ➤ Non-operating revenue (\$132K) consisted of unrealized investment gains, dividends, and interest earnings.
- ➤ The Association's expenses reflected significant support for the University. The Association awarded \$87,000 in scholarships to students, partnered (\$32K) with Alumni Relations to engage the community during national university events (LA, Miami, Indianapolis, etc.) around the country, and provided an additional scholarship gift of \$9,000 from the LA chapter to the University.
- ➤ The Association is not carrying any long-term liability, and as of June 30, 2025 had a minimal amount (\$15K) of current liability (accounts payable).
- ➤ The Association's net assets (equity) on June 30, 2025 were \$1.5 million, an increase of 18.08% vs. the prior year.
- ➤ Most Recent Audited Financial Statement June 30, 2024 The Association received an unmodified opinion
- > Form 990 was filed timely with the IRS. Both reports were provided to the University's Compliance officer.
- > Fiscal Year '25 Financial Data is currently being audited.

NCCUAA Sustainability

Opportunity Areas

- 1. Ensuring Clear Alignment Between Alumni Initiatives and University Strategic Priorities
- > Alumni-led programs are often mission-driven but not always formally mapped to NCCU's current strategic pillars and procedures
- 2. Balancing Independent Operations with Institutional Accountability
- > Evolving policies related to fundraising, data sharing, and engagement require ongoing education from University Administration and adaptation by volunteer leadership
- Capacity constraints among volunteer leadership can limit the ability to fully operationalize alignment requirements without additional infrastructure or support
- 3. Managing Understanding of the Association's Role
- Updated guidelines require extensive education and training for local chapters
